

The Village of Colonie Senior Citizens Center first opened its doors to the public on Mother's Day, 1966. It was the first such center organized in the Town of Colonie. The idea for a center for the exclusive use of senior residents of the Village was conceived by Mayor Bill Cook and Edward Skinner. They decided to use a house which had been donated to the Village of Colonie and moved to the Village municipal property. By 1978, the house had become too small for the more than sixty members of the center to conduct their meetings and activities. The seniors had opted to have their monthly meetings at the Village Hall and to conduct special classes and parties at the Colonie Community Center. A solution had to be found, though, so that all activities could be held under one roof. Finally, with



An RSVP Volunteer Station is an organization where an RSVP member volunteers. It must be a public agency, a non-profit organization or a proprietary health-care agency or organization. The RSVP Volunteer Station must sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), which establishes the responsibilities of both the Capital Region RSVP Sponsor and the RSVP Volunteer Station with respect to RSVP volunteers. By signing the MOU with the Capital Region RSVP Sponsor (CSSC), the RSVP Volunteer Station agrees to offer volunteers appropriate and specific volunteer assignments and to designate a coordinator who will serve as a contact person for both the volunteer and the Capital Region RSVP Sponsor office. The RSVP Volunteer Station agrees to explain all volunteer assignments to these volunteers and provide an orientation and training to the volunteers as necessary to perform their assignments. In this context, Colonie Senior Service Centers is also an RSVP Volunteer Station with multiple locations for volunteer opportunities.

If your household earned less than **\$50,000** you can have your Federal and State income tax return filed for FREE. ACAP's IRS Certified VITA/TCE Volunteer Preparer will help you complete your income tax return according to the current taxation laws. The VITA Program also offers FREE electronic filing of your completed tax return. All services are provided with the strictest confidentiality & accuracy of information.

The VITA Program is open to the public. It starts every February and runs through the first week of April. Services are **by appointment only**.

What to bring:

- Proof identification (License or DMV Non-Drivers ID)
- Social Security cards for you, your spouse and dependents and/or a Social Security number verification letter issued by the Social Security Administration
- Birth dates for you, your spouse and dependents on the tax return
- Wage and earning statements, Form W-2, W2G, 1099-R, from all employers
- Interest and dividend statements from banks (Forms 1099)
- A copy of last year's federal and state returns if available
- Bank routing numbers and account numbers for direct deposit
- Total paid for day care provider(s) and the day care provider(s)'s tax ID number (either social security number or EIN number)
- To file taxes electronically on a married filing joint tax return, both spouses must be present to sign the required forms.

HILL was founded in 1993 by Fred and Helen Adler to make available educational and cultural experiences to residents of the Town of Bethlehem and the greater Capital District. Albany Guardian Society, located in Albany, New York, is one of the region's oldest charitable institutions. In 1850, the benevolent members of the Dorcas Temperance Society found many cases of suffering which they had no power to relieve. They felt that establishing a home for the aged and helpless, along with friendless children, would do much to improve conditions. Fifty-six dollars was collected to begin this effort, and in 1852, the Office of County Deeds certified the original charter for Albany Guardian Society.

From its inception in the mid-1800s until closing the home in 2000, an adult home continuously served seniors. A strategic planning process helped Albany Guardian Society reconfirm its mission to serve seniors. New initiatives were developed which allowed Albany Guardian Society to reach out and benefit more seniors than ever before.

Women, Infants, Children (WIC)
WIC provides participants nutritious foods, nutrition education, and referrals to community services at no charge. WIC serves low to medium income pregnant, postpartum and breastfeeding women, infants, and children (including foster children) up to age 5.

Some of the WIC foods include iron-fortified formula and infant cereal, adult cereal, fruits and vegetables, juice, milk, eggs, soy milk, whole grain tortillas, bread and rice, tofu, cheese, peanut butter, dried beans, and canned fish. During the summer months families receive funds to use at local Farmer's Markets for fresh produce.

WIC Peer Counseling Program
The Peer Counseling Program was created to encourage breastfeeding as the normal way to feed babies.

Services Include:

- Supportive, individual counseling on breastfeeding (telephone and in-person consultations are available)
- Manual, personal use electric, and hospital grade breast pumps for eligible WIC mothers
- Breastfeeding information and educational handouts/videos/DVD's
- Private nursing area in the WIC office
- Special breastfeeding baby scale to check baby's weight during WIC visits
- Breastfeeding Resource information for additional support

Nutrition Outreach and Education Program (NOEP)
The essential goal of the NOEP Program is to promote the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (formerly Food Stamps) across the entire service area of Columbia and Greene Counties, through a variety of methods: community outreach, through collaboration with local social agencies; formal NOEP presentations to a diverse array of social/business agencies and clubs; direct client assistance, involving "pre-screening" for potential program eligibility and extensive help in applying for and maintaining benefits; support/advocacy for clients as they navigate the system with the bulk of the time committed to direct client assistance.
